



Purpose: To describe the psychosocial evaluation process for the potential non-domino therapeutic living donor

Policy: The psychosocial evaluation for the potential non-domino therapeutic living donor is performed prior to organ recovery. The evaluation is performed by a psychiatrist, psychologist, and/or clinical social worker (LMSW). Documentation of the psychosocial evaluation is maintained in the donor record. Key elements of the psychosocial evaluation include:

- Assessment for the presence of risk criteria for acute HIV, HBV, and HCV infection according to the U.S. Public Health Service (PHS) Guideline that may have the potential of disease transmission to the recipient
- Identification of factors that warrant educational or therapeutic intervention prior to final donation decision
- Assessment of whether the decision to donate is free of inducement, coercion and other undue pressure.

Procedure:

- All non-domino therapeutic living donors will be scheduled to meet with the social worker and/or psychologist as part of the evaluation process.
- Additional psychologist or psychiatrist consultation may be recommended at the discretion of the transplant team
- These evaluations will be presented at the Selection Committee to determine eligibility to proceed with non-domino therapeutic donation at Methodist Dallas Medical Center
