Physicians, Transplant Coordinators and Nurse Practitioners**

**CBC**

WBC < 2.0  
HGB <10.0  
HCT < 30.0  
Platelets <30K  
Mg < 1.3

**Chem Panel**

Na+ < 125  
K+ < 3.0  
K+ > 5.5  
Cr > 1.8  
Prograf Level < 5 or >15  
CSA < 50  
Rapa > 15

**Other**

AFP > 100  
ANC (abs neutrophil count) < 600  
Formula for calculating:  
WBC x % Neutrophils x 10 = ANC

**Patient Calls**

Altered mental status or confusion  
Black Stools  
Bleeding of any type (vomiting blood, bloody stools)  
Chest Pain  
Diarrhea (acute)  
Drain falling out  
Drainage from a wound  
Fever (>101° for more than 48 hours)  
No BM x several days  
N/V with inability to keep anything down  
Problems after procedures or surgeries  
Rash  
Severe pain (acute)  
Severe swelling of feet or abdomen  
Shortness of breath  
Trouble swallowing  
Weakness, dizziness  
Wound breakdown

Above alert parameters require immediate physician attention. If physician of record is unavailable, Liver Institute staff is to escalate the alert parameter to the covering physician or physician extender. Immediate attention requires physician to be made aware of alert parameters within 1 hour.

Physicians need to be appraised of all other patient complaints within 24-48 hours
